Origin Story

In 1999 David and LaRae Pepper clearly sensed that God was leading them to a specific mission. David, who was born and raised on the mission fields of Peru, had developed a strong desire to bring a life-giving church to the Meadow Lakes area and the Matanuska-Susitna Valley in Alaska.

The humble beginnings of Church on the Rock started in the home of Dave and Rebecca Dargis, but quickly grew to take up first one, then two spaces at a local strip mall, growing from one service to three. Wasilla Campus was built and opened Easter of 2005 where it was evident that even in the larger facility, two services would still be needed. During this time of growth, we sent out staff to plant a new church in Battleground, Washington.

As the church continued to grow, a second campus was launched in Palmer at Sherrod Elementary School with Pastor Chris and Laurie Miller. Pastor Jonathan and Kitri Walker also headed out to plant a COTR in Homer, Alaska. After five years of partnering with Aaron Weisser to establish COTR Homer, Pastor Jonathan and Kitri were invited to return in 2013, to take the helm as Lead Pastor of COTR here in the Mat-Su Valley.

Church on the Rock has continued to expand its borders, as one church community in multiple locations, now in Palmer, Wasilla, Willow, and Talkeetna/Sunshine. Our Auxiliary Ministries, Thrifters Rock Palmer and Wasilla, and Band of Brothers, serve the mission beyond the walls of the church to impact our community.

Leadership Model

As you consider investing your energy, time, and finances to partner with our COTR family, we know that it is important for you to feel confident and comfortable with our particular leadership model. Our goal in describing COTR's leadership structure is so you can better understand how our church intentionally contends for an environment that values integrity, accountability, and spiritual authority.

SHEPHERDING ELDERS AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Shepherding Elders - Seek God's direction for the purpose of COTR and provide Godly counsel in the pursuit of accomplishing that mission. They also provide shepherding care for the local campus they represent. Lastly, they provide to the Board of Directors an annual assessment of the Lead Pastor's spiritual health and leadership effectiveness.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Board of Directors - Ensures that COTR functions in an ethical manner at a responsible cost as we seek to fulfill our purpose. They do so by providing the framework for how we function through written policies and routine assessments.

CENTRAL LEADERSHIP

This core team is responsible for managing the operations of COTR in the accomplishment of our vision and purpose. This team is typically composed of three roles:

- Lead Pastor
- Director/Pastor of Ministries
- Director/Pastor of Operations

CAMPUS PASTORS

They provide oversight and leadership at their local campus within the established vision, purpose, and structure of COTR. They are the first line of shepherding and managerial authority for their local staff and congregation.

CENTRAL SERVICES

This team supports all COTR campuses as well as our Auxiliary Ministries by providing:

- Budgeting and accounting services and oversight
- Data management, systems, and communications
- Local and global missions outreach and direction
- Graphic design, website management, and social media support



Statement of Faith

Complete Doctrinal Statement ABOUT GOD

God is the Creator and Ruler of the universe and all created things. He has eternally existed in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. These three are distinct in personage yet co-equal in power, authority and eternal existence and yet are one God.

ABOUT THE FATHER

The Scriptural lists of these gifts are not necessarily exhaustive, and the gifts may occur in various combinations. All believers are commanded to earnestly desire the manifestation of the gifts in their lives. These gifts always operate in harmony with the Scriptures and should never be used in violation of Biblical parameters.

ABOUT HUMANITY

Men and women were created in the "image" of God, to be like Him in character and nature. We are the supreme object of God's affection in creation. Although humanity has tremendous potential for good, we are marred by an attitude of disobedience toward God called sinful desire. When our desires lead us to sin, sin separates us from God.

ABOUT ETERNITY

Humanity was created to exist forever. We will either exist eternally separated from God through un-repentance, or in union with God through salvation. ABOUT BAPTISM

Water: Water baptism is an ordinance (commanded observance) through which the believer publicly confesses their faith in Jesus Christ by obedience to this command. The biblical illustration of this event involves full submersion, and is done in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

Infilling of the Holy Spirit: Being "filled with" or "baptized in" the Holy Spirit is intended to be an ongoing experience in the life of the believer. It is necessary for the empowerment of the believer and for the work of the ministry. The primary indicators of the Spirit filled life are: a boldness to proclaim the Gospel, desire for fellowship with one another, the "fruit of the Spirit", empowerment in the gifts of the Spirit, and the sanctification of the believer.

ABOUT COMMUNION

Communion, along with baptism, is one of two ordinances (commanded observances) given directly by Christ. When we join together for the "Lord's Supper" we celebrate the willing sacrifice of Christ and anticipate His return. We believe that communion is a symbolic act that by faith calls to mind real events and embraces the ministry and presence of Christ in a unique way. It is intended for the believer and is to be taken in a "manner worthy" of Christ.

ABOUT THE BIBLE

The Bible is God's Word to all humanity, written by human authors under the supernatural guidance of the Holy Spirit. Distortions

The following behaviors and lifestyles listed, although not comprehensive, are some of the sinful distortions of God's good intentions regarding the gift of sex and sexuality. We believe that every person possesses desires that are contrary to God's design. Simply possessing these desires does not inherently equal sin. It is the willingness to take action on these desires or to fantasize about them that is sinful.

CO-HABITATION - any couple living together (even if in different beds) without being married. Engaged, intention to marry, soul mates, and any other commonly used term that does not include a recognized marriage performed by an ordained licensed minister and/or legal representative of the State.

BISEXUALITY - an individual engaging in both heterosexual & homosexual activity.

HOMOSEXUALITY - sexual activity between members of the same sex.

TRANSGENDER - state of one's 'gender identity' (self-identification as male, female, both or neither) not matching one's biological sex at birth.

TRANSSEXUAL - someone who has undergone surgical and/or hormonal treatment to change his/her anatomical sex or someone who identifies himself/herself as a member of the opposite sex.

CROSS-DRESSING/TRANSVESTITE -

individuals wearing clothing of the opposite sex for the purpose of sexual gratification and/or with the intention of identifying as a member of the opposite sex.

BEASTIALITY - sexual activity between a human being & an animal.

PEDOPHILIA - the crime of an adult engaging in sexual activity with a child and/or the pursuit to fulfill a sexual desire for children .

INCEST - sexual activity between immediate family members related either by blood or marriage.

PORNOGRAPHY - engaging with films, magazines, writings, photographs, or other materials that are sexually explicit, with the intent of causing sexual arousal and/or gratification.

RAPE - forcing sexual activity against someone's will.

DOMINEERING BONDAGE - the practice of being tied up or restrained physically during sexual activity for the purpose of degrading and/or dominating another person.

MASOCHISM - sexual gratification achieved by physical and/or verbal abuse.

SADISM - the gaining of sexual gratification by causing physical or mental pain to another person, or the acts that produce such gratification.

The gift of apostleship is the divine strength or ability to pioneer new churches and ministries through planting, overseeing, and training.

CRAFTSMANSHIP

The gift of craftsmanship is the divine strength or ability to plan, build, and work with your hands in construction environments to accomplish multiple ministry applications.

DISCERNMENT

The gift of discernment is the divine strength or ability to spiritually identify falsehood, to distinguish between right and wrong motives and the spiritual forces at work in situations.

EVANGELISM

EXHORTATION

The gift of exhortation is the divine strength or ability to strengthen, comfort or urge others to action through the written or spoken word and Biblical truth.

FAITH

The gift of faith is the divine strength or ability to believe in God for unseen supernatural results in every arena of life.

The gift of giving is the divine strength or ability to produce wealth and to give by tithes and offerings for the purpose of advancing the Kingdom of God on earth.

The gift of helps is the divine strength or ability to work in a supportive role for the accomplishment of tasks in Christian ministry with the ability to often see the need before others do.

HOSPITALITY

The gift of hospitality is the divine strength or ability to create warm, welcoming environments for others in places such as your home, office, or church.

INTERCESSION

The gift of intercession is the divine strength or ability to stand in the gap in prayer for someone, something, or someplace, believing for profound results.

KNOWLEDGE

The gift of knowledge is the divine strength or ability to bring truth to a situation by supernatural revelation. This is often accompanied by a word from God.

LEADERSHIP

The gift of leadership is the divine strength or ability to influence people at their level while directing and focusing them on the big picture, vision, or idea.

The gift of mercy is the divine strength or ability to feel empathy and to care for those who are hurting in any way.

The gift of miracles is the divine strength or ability to alter the natural outcomes of life in a supernatural way through prayer, faith, and divine direction.

PASTOR/SHEPHERD

The gift of pastor/shepherd is the divine strength or ability to care for the personal needs of others by nurturing and mending life issues.

It is our hope that you join a group and make a difference by sharing your strengths.

- Small groups They meet regularly around a specific theme or study with the intention of spiritual growth. Small groups have a beginning and end date.
- Life Groups These groups meet to foster an environment of support, authenticity, & growth. They meet over a longer term with no end date.
- Serve Teams We can grow in relationship fastest by serving together. Serve Teams are designed to be more than a group meeting to serve on a Sunday.

Mission Myopia

Mission Myopia is our natural tendency to attract around us people who see things in the same way, or impose upon others our own priorities and practices in ministry.

- We are most comfortable with people who share our interests, values, and perspectives.
- Mission Myopia is about an individual's emotional needs or ego being elevated above the needs and priorities of the mission.
- Ministry mission will require the support of people who often see and think differently than ourselves.

Diversity

Your success as part of a Serve Team will be determined in large part by your ability to:

- <u>recognize</u> and <u>respect</u> other people's <u>perspectives</u> and <u>gifting</u>.
- genuinely <u>value</u> what others <u>contribute</u> to the mission.
- <u>respect</u> and <u>serve</u> under the <u>leadership</u> of others.
